We would like to thank the many, many residents who took the time to share their thoughts about the hamlet of Lac La Biche's water tower.


We received more than a thousand responses to an online survey, and nearly 70 per cent of participants voted in favour of keeping and repainting the tower, rather than demolishing it.

Are your spruce trees dying?

We've been receiving lots of calls from residents who are having trouble with their spruce trees. If your trees have been struggling lately, it could be due to one of these two common fungal problems that are known to occur in our area.

Cytospora Spruce Canker


Signs: Trunk and branch lesions, deformations, reduced growth, white pitch flow

Controls: Water affected trees, cut and burn branches that have red needles in the fall and winter, use a balanced fertilizer

Rhizosphaera Needle Cast

Signs: Needles dying, new growth on tips followed by brown or purple needles, tiny black bumps on needles **Controls:** Prune and burn infected branches, remove bottom branches as the fungus usually starts low and moves upward, apply fungicide in the spring and early summer

WORKINGS OF THE WATERSHED

Our Watershed Management Plan is designed to keep the lands and waters that drain into Lac la Biche (the lake) healthy and sustainable.

You can read the plan online at **laclabichecounty.com**. Ongoing goals include reducing algae blooms, and boosting the lake's recreational value and the region's economy.

The lake is affected by everything that goes on around it, so the plan has a full implementation committee to make sure it stays on track. Information about the committee's activities, including current priorities and upcoming projects to improve watershed health, can also be found on our website.

Plamondon wetland reconstruction

Wetlands are an important part of our ecosystem, but lots of them in our area have been disturbed by development over the years.

Starting this month, we're going to rebuild a wetland at the site of the former reservoir in Plamondon. Restoring 1.4 hectares of wetland will improve water quality, flood mitigation and drought resistance in the surrounding area, including Plamondon Creek, and local schools and residents will be able to help with planting vegetation next year. This project was made possible through Alberta Environment and Parks' Wetland Replacement Program and Watershed Resiliency and Restoration Program.
