# Tips for a Safe and Healthy Holiday

#### From Fire Chief John Kokotilo:

- Have your furnace and other heating appliances (electric space heaters) checked
   do not overload electrical circuits.
- 2. Always cover your fireplace with a screen and have your chimneys and vents checked.
- 3. Do not remove fireplace embers unless cold to the touch.
- 4. Test your smoke alarm and be aware of your escape plan.
- 5. Do not leave lit candles unattended.
- 6. When cooking, do not leave the kitchen unattended. If you need to leave the kitchen, turn off cooking appliances.
- 7. Remember when enjoying the outdoors, no ice is safe ice. Always be aware of the ice conditions.

### From Manager of Enforcement Services Chris Clark:

- 1. Don't drink and drive. Winter brings an increase in impaired driving incidents, so make sure to plan accordingly if you're going to be drinking. Arrange a ride home, and don't let friends and family drive under the influence.
- 2. Drive to road conditions. As road conditions deteriorate in the winter, reduce your speed. We want everyone to arrive at their destinations safely.
- 3. Secure your property if you're leaving on holidays. Make sure your doors are locked, and set your lights to timers if possible. Have a friend or relative check on your property and clear snow, use a security system, and make sure your blinds or curtains are drawn.

# **Christmas Tree Recycling Program Returns for Another Year**



If your New Year's resolution is to recycle more, you can start by recycling your Christmas tree. From January 4-15, residents with curbside pickup service can call (780) 623-6739 to have their trees taken away and recycled. If you live in a rural area, or if you miss the deadline, you can bring your tree to any landfill or transfer station at no charge.

Only natural trees will be accepted for recycling, and trees must not have any decorations left on them.

For every tree that we recycle, a new one will be planted in a local park.

## **MuniSight Launches to the Public Online**

A new way to view Lac La Biche County is now available online. MuniSight is the County's web-based mapping system, which allows you to view property boundaries, County roads, utility lines, and other details that everyday residents, developers, real estate agents, and more will find useful.

If you'd like to see for yourself, visit laclabichecounty.com, and go the MuniSight Page. From there, you will need to login. Once you login (as a guest) you'll be able to see all of the publicly available information.

MuniSight has many ways to show you Lac La Biche County, and the information can be filtered in many different ways. If you're interested in fire boundaries, railways, municipal zoning, electoral boundaries, water lines, or gas lines, there are filters you can apply

to the map to view them individually or together.
There are many more filter features on MuniSight, and they're waiting for you to try them out.

There are several different ways to search for information as well. The legend shows you the map with all the filters you've selected or de-selected. The search function allows you to find what you're looking for by entering a location. Routing allows users to select multiple points and calculate the distance between them.

We're excited to be able to offer MuniSight to the public, but if it doesn't interest you, we still have quickreference maps available on our website. We have maps for Lac La Biche County boundaries, County facilities locations, fire permits, landfill locations, and ward locations.
