County Council appoints CAO

At the May 24, 2022 Regular Council Meeting, Lac La Biche County Council appointed Mr. Dan Small as the County's permanent Chief Administrative Officer (CAO).

The CAO is Council's only employee, carrying out their direction and leading Lac La Biche County's administration. The appointment follows a thorough and competitive hiring process.

Mr. Small has over 10 years of senior leadership experience in Lac La Biche County in the finance, grants, and land use planning areas, and led County efforts to become a specialized municipality in 2018.

Prior to joining Lac La Biche County in 2012, Mr. Small was CAO of Thorhild County. A chartered professional accountant with experience in the oil and gas industry, he continues to manage a family farm near Radway, Alberta.

He has been acting as CAO of Lac La Biche County since January 2022.

"Lac La Biche County is a shining example of innovative local government and is gradually being looked upon as a leader in Alberta," says Mr. Small.

"I'm looking forward to continuing to implement Council's strategic direction in collaboration with our communities, my colleagues, and the public."

No increase to Municipal Tax Rate

Lac La Biche County Council has approved the 2022 Tax Rate Bylaw which keeps municipal tax rates for all classes of property the same as they were in 2020 and 2021.

As the economy continues to recover, a priority for Council when considering the upcoming year is to encourage growth and investment, while helping families get back on their feet.

"Council felt that due to the challenges our residents have faced over the last couple of years, the recent increases in utilities, and the rising cost of living overall, it was important to not raise taxes," says Mayor Paul Reutov.

"Lac La Biche County residents can continue to enjoy excellent municipal programs and services while paying one of the lowest residential tax rates in Alberta."

Provincial Requisitions

The Government of Alberta sets a budget for education each year, and then requisitions funding from municipalities. Your portion of this education tax is included in the tax notice you receive by mail.

For 2022, the education requisition has increased 2.83% for residential and farmland, and 3.14% for non-residential.

The County is also a member of the Greater North Foundation, which operates seniors' lodges in Lac La Biche, Athabasca, and Boyle.

The Foundation's requisition and tax rate have decreased by 5.72%.

The Provincial Assessor invoices the County for the assessment costs related to designated industrial properties. For 2022, the rate for this requisition is set at \$0.0766 per 1000 dollars of assessment.

This means is if you see an increase or decrease in your tax bill this year, it will be due to changes in your property's assessed value, increases in provincial requisitions, or both. Refer to the Tax Account Details on your Property Assessment and Tax Notice to see how the total amount of your taxes has been calculated.

County Tax Revenues

In 2022 taxes will result in revenues of \$67,443,299. This is an increase of \$216,923 compared to budgeted revenues of \$67,226,376.

Property Tax Payments

Taxes are due and payable without penalty on or before June 30, 2022.

Tax and Assessment notices were mailed out on May 20, 2022.

There are a variety of payment options available including in-person payments, cheques by mail, internet and telephone banking, and autopay.

Wetland Restoration Workshop

A hands-on workshop planned for Earth Day will offer residents a great learning opportunity as part of a wetlands restoration project.

The free one-day event on Sunday, June 5, 9 am to 4 pm, offers training about building wetlands with native vegetation to restore habitat, provide biodiversity support, and reduce erosion.

It is being held at the Bold Center as part of a project to build a new wetland near the facility. An overview of the types of plant material and installation methods will be provided. Participants will work together to install aquatic species in wetlands and native woody riparian vegetation in the wetland buffers.
