Municipal Development Plan update slated this year

You're Invited! MDP Open House May 18 - 4 to 8 pm

The development needs of a community change over time and moving down a path determined from community input is key to successful growth.

A Municipal Development Plan (MDP) is a key policy plan that communicates the long term desired land use for Lac La Biche County. It is a high-level blueprint that shows how the community is expected to change over time and the shape it will take in the future.

The County's Planning & Development Department is completing a detailed review and rewrite of the Municipal Development Plan to reflect the needs of the community.

The existing Municipal Development Plan was approved in 2013 during a time of fast-paced economic growth largely driven by the oil and gas industry. Economic conditions have changed and an update is required.

Community Participation

The MDP aims to build consensus around how the community chooses to change. The participatory process planned will provide the opportunity to discuss various points of view, and gain appreciation for different opinions.

Most importantly, it will help build the consensus the community needs on the major topics covered by the Municipal Development Plan.

Protect your property: FireSmart assessments

Complete a FireSmart assessment of your property and be entered into a draw to win one of two chainsaws!

Lac La Biche County Fire Services is offering free home assessments and free wood chipping services for residents interested in protecting their properties from the threat of wildfire.

In 2022, when you book an appointment to complete a FireSmart assessment, your name is entered in the draw to win a Stihl chainsaw. There are two saws up for grabs, with one draw taking place in summer and another in the fall.

FireSmart assessments evaluate your property for combustible materials and potential fire hazards should a wildfire take place. Embers from wildfires can travel for miles and increase the risk for those living in rural areas of our County.

"Often the things identified in an assessment that can significantly reduce the fire hazard are investments of time and energy to remove combustible materials, rather than investments of money," says John Kokotilo, Lac La Biche County Regional Fire Chief.

Of course, the assessments come with a full range of suggestions than can be carried out as time and money allows. Upgrades to roofing and siding materials, thinning



out tree growth on your property, and adding external fire supression systems, such as rooftop sprinklers, can also be considered by home owners as they work to make their property more fire resistant.

Accessory Buildings

Everything you need to know about adding one to your property

An accessory building is a permanent or temporary structure that exists on the same lot as a main building but, as its name suggests, serves an accessory purpose (detached garage, shed, storage building, gazebo, farm shop, etc.).

Accessory buildings are not intended for occupancy like dwellings. They are intended to support a lot's existing use. If a structure is connected to the main building on a lot, then it is considered part of the main building and not an accessory building in most cases.

Depending on the property's size and the zoning regulations that apply (residential, commercial, etc.) height regulations vary:

- On lots one acre or less in size in a designated hamlet, accessory buildings cannot be taller than 15 feet.
- On lots larger than one acre, accessory buildings cannot be taller than 21 feet.
- On lots in Direct Control District 1 (Elinor Lake Resort) accessory buildings cannot be taller than 16.1 feet.
- There are no height restrictions on properties in the Agricultural zoning category. In all other zoning categories, accessory buildings cannot be taller than the main building on-site.

Applying for a permit

A new accessory building requires a development permit. The following is required as part of the application:

- Completed application form. Available online at www.laclabichecounty.com.
- Current certificate of title. Dated within 30 days of application being submitted.
- Landowner's signature. If the parcel does not belong to you, or you are acting as an agent on behalf of the landowner, a signature or letter of authorization from all listed registered landowner(s) is required.

- Site plan. This is a layout of your project, showing where the development will occur. Include property line setbacks.
- Any other information the Development Authority (Lac La Biche County) considers necessary.

Additional requirements may include, but are not limited to:

- A Roadside Development Permit issued by Alberta Transportation if your property is within 800 metres of a provincial highway.
- A geotechnical report if your property has a slope of more than 15%, or a soil investigation.
- A grading plan.

Safety Code Permits

The Inspections Group Inc. is responsible for Safety Codes inspections and permitting in Lac La Biche County.

You will need to get a Building Permit, as well as Gas, Electrical, Plumbing and Private Sewage Disposal System Permits if these services are installed.

These permits are in addition to the development permit, and they ensure a development meets all necessary safety standards and legislation.

For garages more than 55 m2 in area, or any two-storey garages, foundation walls and footings must be reviewed by a registered architectural or engineering professional.
