PROPERTY TAXES FOR 2023

Property tax notices are in the mail, and ratepayers have until Friday, June 30 to pay taxes without penalties.

2023 LAC LA BICHE COUNTY TAX RATES	
Residential & Farmland	3.2448
Urban Non-Residential	10.000
Rural Non-Residential	18.7320

The rates above represent how much municipal tax you owe per \$1,000 of assessed property value. The County has no control over assessments; we also have no control over the provincial requisitions for education and seniors' lodges that get added to your tax bill.

Council decided to increase residential, farmland and rural non-residential rates slightly for 2023. There are several reasons why this happened:

- 1. The Government of Alberta requires municipalities to achieve a 5:1 ratio between their highest and lowest tax rates. There is no specific timeline to meet this requirement, but we have to move in that direction. Our ratio in 2023 will be 5.77:1, down from last year's ratio of 5.89:1.
- 2. Inflation affects the County just like everyone else. Goods we buy and services we use cost more from year to year.
- 3. The County has historically provided services to residents at very subsidized costs. For example, our water and sewer fees are very low, despite the high costs of building and maintaining these utilities.

The residential mill rate has only increased by 0.1248 mills, so the owner of a \$450,000 home in Lac La Biche County will pay around \$56 more in municipal taxes this year.

Council has taken the above factors into consideration, but doesn't want to burden residents.

Lac La Biche County's residential tax rate remains one of the lowest in Alberta. The property value your tax bill is based on and the provincial requisitions that get added play big roles in how expensive your total bill becomes.

What you get in return for your taxes:



State-of-the-art recreation facilities, including a brand-new aquatics centre (construction will start later this year)



Parks and playgrounds, outdoor rinks, walking trails and boat launches (more per resident than comparable municipalities)



Road maintenance like dust control, gravelling, pothole-patching and snow removal on 2000-plus kilometres of roads



Firefighters and Peace Officers, as well as emergency prevention and preparedness programs that are free for residents



Social, wellness and community-building programs for local children, youth, families and seniors



Grants for community groups, event sponsorships and more (over \$2.5 million given each year for the last three years)



Landfills and transfer stations (where loads of up to 500 kg. of residential waste are free) and the curbside pickup program



Water, sewer and natural gas services, which are provided at subsidized rates, and fill stations for rural residents



Programs that protect our natural environment and lakes, and services that support local agricultural producers

Business Patio & Sidewalk Furniture

With Main Street in the hamlet of Lac La Biche being rebuilt to become more attractive and friendly to pedestrians, local restaurants may be thinking about using the sidewalks in front of their premises as patios. This is a great idea! If the sidewalk is County property, like the ones on Main Street, then a License of Occupation (LOC) is required.

Fortunately, LOCs are easy and inexpensive. Business owners should submit requests by email to **planning.development@laclabichecounty.com**, and be sure to include details about their intended uses of the sidewalk (e.g. two tables and four chairs, etc.), the hours of operation and the agreement length they have in mind (e.g. six months, etc.) The fee to apply for an LOC is \$30 per agreement.

USED AGRICULTURAL PLASTICS
