### Citizens Satisfaction Survey results

We would like to thank everyone who participated in our 2024 Citizens Satisfaction Survey. This survey tracks how our programs and services are meeting our residents' needs, and which service categories they consider to be most important to them.

### **Cultivating economic growth & agri-tourism**

We're planting the seeds of a bountiful agri-tourism harvest, and all community members are invited to reap some of what we're sowing.

We are launching an agri-tourism workshop series this fall, to bring local producers, retailers and partners together and grow bold new ideas for our region.

### What is agri-tourism?

Agri-tourism is any type of tourism that connects to agriculture. Think farm tours, farmers markets, you-pick harvesting, farm-to-table dining and more. Agri-tourism can also include unique accommodations like guest ranches, or recreational activities like hayrides.

Future workshop topics include value-added agriculture, cluster development (working together to build capacity and tap into new markets), connecting local ingredients with local vendors and restaurants, and more. ## New Aquatics Facility: A deep dive into a design-build

Construction of our new Aquatics Facility is well underway, and as part of the "design as you build" process we've adopted for maximum flexibility, Council has been discussing the different features that can be included in the facility to make it as dynamic and enjoyable a place as possible.

Council recently voted to include a barrel sauna in the facility's outdoor space, to complement the outdoor hot tub and fireside seating area and give guests a spa-like experience.

Inside, waterslides and play features like geysers are still under discussion. Here's what we know so far:

- The main waterslide will have programmable lights, so users can slide through an immersive light show.
- The main slide will also have a rider timing system, for friends who like to compete.
- The leisure pool will have interactive play features like geysers and waterspouts, and an adjoining lazy river for those who like nothing better than a relaxing float.

Lac La Biche County recently completed a deep dive into our own operations, as part of our ongoing mission to provide value for taxpayers' money.

We typically provide very high service levels, but our next steps include deciding on service standards, so County employees, Council and our residents are all on the same page about what we do and don't provide. This information will also help Council make decisions in line with what people need from us.

Some areas where greater efficiency can be found in our organization, as noted in the Efficiency Review Report, include:

- **Governance:** Council and staff members have different roles, and it's important to stay in our respective lanes.
- **Technology:** There are opportunities to modernize the way we do things, making our services more accessible and convenient.
- **Communication:** There's a need for enhanced communication between us and the public, as well as internally between our different departments and divisions.

In the months ahead, as we get to work on the report recommendations, we will be making changes to our organization to become more cost-effective in our program and service delivery.

We have a free online mapping system that allows anyone to see property zoning, water and sewer line networks, wetland locations and more in Lac La Biche County.

### To use the system:


- 1. Go to **laclabichecounty.com/p/maps** and scroll to "County Mapping System."
- 2. Click on "Login as guest" and agree to the system's terms and conditions.
- 3. Use the sidebar to toggle layers and change map features.
- 4. Click on a specific property to see tax information and development permit history.

**Note:** Guest users cannot see personal information about property owners.
