Land Acknowledgment

• The One-Day Traditional Pow Wow marks an important step on the road to reconciliation, creating an opportunity for all peoples to learn more about Indigenous culture and worldviews, Pow Wow elements and traditions, etc.

• The event organizers are actively consulting with Elders, Knowledge Keepers, etc. and are committed to ensuring the One-Day Traditional Pow Wow is authentic and respectful in every way.

• The One-Day Traditional Pow Wow is a celebration of community-building and partnerships, in honour of the Treaties and the reciprocal relationships that are meant to exist between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples.

• The event will be groundbreaking and historic, and it will highlight our region's unique character and diversity in ways that will inspire other communities.

wahkotowin Sponsorship

Our partnership is rooted in reciprocity, respect, reconciliation, and repatriation. wahkotowin is one of the Cree laws, referring to our kinship and interconnectedness with everyone and everything.



kihew (eagle) represents love, high respect and prominence. Love is the first law the Creator provided. kihew reminds us to love and care for one another, the land we walk on, and everything sharing the world with us.



paskwâwimostos (buffalo) represents respect.

The buffalo gave himself to the people to be a protector because he respected them and would always look after them.



maskwa (bear) represents courage.

The bear teaches us to be courageous and to always do the right thing, even when it's difficult. What you give will always come back to you tenfold. maskwa inspires us to be strong and to lift up others.
