Lac La Biche County's Backflow Preventor Subsidy Program provides up to \$1,000 to install interior backflow preventors.

## Our program targets:

- All homes in the hamlets of Lac La Biche and Plamondon that do not have a septic tank.
- Those who have had previous basement flooding from sanitary sewer backup.

### To be eligible for the program you must:

- Not have an existing backflow preventor in your home.
- Not have previously received a backflow preventor subsidy for the application address.
- Have your home separately serviced (single family dwelling or duplex).
- Have a pre-approval inspection completed by Lac La Biche County staff.

# **Application Process**

1. Get pre-approved.

Before installing your backflow preventor, please email your name, address, and contact number to <a href="mailto:utilitiesadmin@laclabichecounty.com">utilitiesadmin@laclabichecounty.com</a>. Once you get approval back via email, installation of a backflow preventor can proceed.

## 2. Install the backflow preventor within 6 months of email approval.

A professional plumber must install the backflow preventor. Only the following valves will be subsidized:

- Fullport Backwater Valve
- FR-4 Fullport Retro Backwater Valve
- Adapt-a-Valve

## 3. Submit the application within 6 months of our inspection.

You must submit the application within 6 months of the inspection, or the installation will no longer qualify for the subsidy. The application must include proof of professional installation with an invoice that notes the model of valve installed.

#### Conditions:

The subsidy, up to \$1000, will be paid by cheque made payable to the applicant. If the total purchase amount of your new backflow preventor is less than the rebate amount, you will receive a rebate of the total purchase amount. Subsidies are subject to available funding and are provided on a first-come, first-served basis. Receiving a subsidy just by applying for the program is not guaranteed.
