

Halloween Safety



Ghosts, ghouls, goblins, and face masks?

This Halloween may look a little different than previous years. Each family will have to decide if they feel comfortable going out or staying in. If you do plan on trick-or-treating this year, here are some safety tips to follow:

- Wear a face mask when physical distancing isn't possible.
- Bring hand sanitizer to regularly clean your hands. If you're handing out candy, regularly sanitize your door bell and other high-touch areas.
- Cross streets at intersections or crosswalks. Watch for traffic, and never cross a road between parked cars.
- Make sure that you're seen by staying in well-lit areas and wearing reflective clothing or glow sticks.
- Go trick-or-treating with an adult, and stay with your cohort.
- Wear warm layers under your costume.
- Don't eat your candy until an adult checks it. Consider letting your treats sit for a day to let any possible virus die off.

If you feel safer staying in, here are some ideas to make Halloween fun at home:

- Have a Halloween hunt (like an Easter egg hunt) or a scavenger hunt in your house or backyard.
- Decorate Halloween cookies.
- Host a Halloween movie night with your cohort.

Snow Clearing for Seniors and Persons with Disabilities

The first snow fall is right around the corner and like most things in life, it is better to be prepared. Lac La Biche County has three programs designed to help seniors and people with disabilities manage snow on sidewalks and driveways.

Snow Angels

- Seniors and people with disabilities can register for this program at no cost. Registered properties will receive specially made Snow Angels signs.
- The signs indicate that residents need help clearing snow from **driveways and front walkways**. Anyone who sees a Snow Angels sign is invited to take care of the shoveling at that property.

Seniors Sidewalk Clearing Program

- Seniors and people with disabilities over the age of 65 without an able-bodied member of the same household under 65 years of age can register for this program at no cost. Participants must live within the Hamlet of Lac La Biche or the Hamlet of Plamondon.
- Community groups and non-profit organizations can sign up to clear snow from **sidewalks** at registered properties. These groups are compensated by the County for their work.

Senior Snowplowing

- Seniors and people with disabilities over the age of 65 can register to have their **driveway** plowed.
- Snowplowing will take place only after the public roads have been cleared of snow.
- A senior snowplowing agreement must be signed.

PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT:

Opening a Home-Based Business

You've drafted a business plan, set up a workspace, and you're ready to go but did you know that before you open a home-based business, you must apply for a development permit?

Home-based businesses are regulated in Lac La Biche County under the Land Use Bylaw. A development permit will confirm that the proposed business complies with the regulations of the Land Use Bylaw and that it is compatible with adjacent land uses.

There are three (3) different types of home-based businesses:

- 1) A Minor Home Business** involves using a portion of the main dwelling, and some examples are consultants, crafters, estheticians.
- 2) A Major Home Business** involves using a portion of the main dwelling and/or its accessory buildings and/or site. Some examples are small engine repairs, vehicle detailing and food preparations with the intent to sell the product.
- 3) An Agricultural Home Business** is run by the permanent residents and uses the dwelling and farm buildings for a business that is secondary to the overall agricultural use.

In addition to a development permit, you will need to get a Building Permit. This is required even if your home-based business is going to be in the main dwelling, because this is considered a change in the property's use. Creating a home-based business in a dwelling or accessory building changes the use and as a result, a Building Permit is required to ensure that the proposal meets the requirement of the Safety Codes Act.

Once the necessary permits are issued, they are valid for the life of the business as long as the scope does not change and that it does not move locations.

Who should you call?

Lac La Biche County Peace Officers and the local RCMP detachment work together to keep our community safe, but they have different responsibilities.

RCMP

Non-emergency: 780-623-4380

Emergency: 911

Immediate Assistance (911)

- Any life-threatening emergency
- A crime in progress
- Impaired drivers
- Motor vehicle collisions

Non-Emergency

- Theft of property and items
- Theft of a vehicle
- Break-ins or thefts where the suspect is gone
- Suspicious vehicle, person or activity
- Non-urgent cases where immediate police attendance is not crucial



Peace Officers

Community Standards

- Unsafe, unsightly, or untidy yards
- Land use and zoning complaints, derelict buildings
- Homeless encampments
- Illegal trash disposal, littering, and graffiti
- Loitering
- Excessive noise during County quiet time (11 pm - 7 am weekdays, 11 pm - 9 am holidays)

Traffic

- Speeding complaints
- Insecure loads
- Commercial vehicles and overweight complaints

Other

- Fire permits (Fire Protection Bylaw)
- Animal control (Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw)
- Public intoxication
- Harassment/Fighting (Community Safety Bylaw)

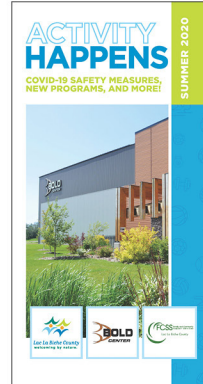
