Description:

The Agricultural Service Board is an advisory board of Lac La Biche County which reviews and makes recommendations on agricultural policies and other agriculture related matters of the County.

VSI's primary objectives are:(a) To promote and encourage the practice of veterinary medicine, (b) To assist the livestock industries of Alberta by encouraging and providing the means by which professional veterinary services can be provided, (c) To encourage preventative veterinary medicine and (d) To enter into agreements with municipal corporations to provide assistance, to livestock producers with the cost of veterinary services.

Members of the Agricultural Service Board are also appointed as the committee for appeals under the Soil Conservation Act. Term of appointment is January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021 for this committee.
