

What Goes Where?



RECYCLING



CURBSIDE PICK-UP

PLASTIC (CLEAN)

- Hard/rigid household bottles and containers (e.g. shampoo, margarine, yogurt, labels are okay)
- Stretchy plastic bags, combine into one bag and tie closed



PAPER & CARDBOARD (CLEAN)

- Newsprint and paper (not shredded)
- Magazines and paperback books
- Gift wrap (non-metallic)
- Cardboard boxes (flattened), and box board (cereal boxes, etc.)
- Pizza boxes with food and paper liner removed
- Hardcover books can be recycled once the cover is removed



HOUSEHOLD METAL (CLEAN)

- Cans (labels are okay) and lids
- Aluminum trays
- Metal coffee cans



REDEEMABLE ITEMS

The following can also be redeemed for deposit at the recycling depot:

- Milk jugs and cartons
- Tetra-paks (juice boxes)
- Pop/beverage bottles, plastic only
- Pop/beverage cans
- Coffee creamer bottles



What about Agricultural Pesticide & Fertilizer Containers?

These must be taken to Ag Retailers (point of purchase) for recycling.

They are no longer accepted at landfills and transfer stations for recycling.

What Goes Where? is now online!

Lac La Biche County now offers help determining what items should be recycled and what is more suited for landfill. Just enter the name of item in our new Search Wizard and it will tell you where you can drop it off and provide directions to the transfer station or landfill.

RECYCLING AT LANDFILLS & TRANSFER STATION

PLASTIC

- All plastics as listed in the curbside recycling column.
- Agricultural twine (unknotted in a clear plastic bag, tied closed)



MIXED PAPER AND CARDBOARD

- All clean paper and cardboard as listed in the curbside recycling column.
- Shredded paper (must be in clear plastic bag)

APPLIANCES AND METAL

- Household metals such as aluminum trays and cans, or metal coffee cans.
- BBQs, lawnmowers, tools, refrigerators, etc.
- Fire extinguishers and propane tanks (emptied and vented)

CEMENT, ASPHALT, SOIL, GRAVEL (landfills only — call prior to disposal)

AUTOMOTIVE AND MOTORIZED

- Tires (no tracks)
- Car parts or ATVs must have batteries and fluids removed



WOOD (no nails)

- Wood chips, stumps, brush, pallets
- Keep painted or treated wood items separate

LIGHTING

- Fluorescent tubes/ballasts, compact fluorescents, halogens, etc.



PAINTS, STAINS AND FINISHES

ELECTRONICS

- Anything with a cord or battery (including cellphones)
- Ink cartridges



BATTERIES

- All battery types must be kept separate and stored in their original packaging, or in a plastic container (not metal)
- It is recommended to add clear tape to the terminals on the batteries to avoid hazards such as fires.

OIL PRODUCTS (no cooking oil)

- Lubricating oil, free of contaminants
- Oil filters and containers

GLYCOL AND ANTIFREEZE

STYROFOAM

- Only clean, white #6 Styrofoam
- No packing peanuts or food containers

Currently, Styrofoam can't be recycled through the curbside pickup program.

WASTE

CURBSIDE, ALSO LANDFILLS & TRANSFER STATIONS

NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTIC

- Soiled plastic
- Chip bags and candy wrappers
- Coffee pods and K-cups
- Plastic plates and cutlery
- Plastic film packaging (such as toilet paper packaging or plastic wrap)



NON-RECYCLABLE HOUSEHOLD METAL

- Aluminum foil
- Soiled household metal



NON-RECYCLABLE PAPER AND CARDBOARD

- Soiled paper or cardboard (take-out containers, etc.)
- Tissue, paper towels, laminated paper items
- Pet food bags, flour bags, etc.
- Paper cups (coffee, soda, etc.)



FOOD WASTE

- Table scraps, spoiled food, cooking oil/grease (cooled)
- Meat remains/bones/shells (wrapped in newspaper; no carcasses)



Much of this food waste can go into either a composter or a Green Cone. Check out the other side of this page.



NON-RECYCLABLE STYROFOAM

GLASS AND CERAMICS

- Plate glass, mirrors, broken glass (wrapped in paper), food jars
- Incandescent light bulbs

ORGANICS

- Pet feces/cat litter (bagged)
- Cigarette/wood ashes (cold and bagged)



HOUSEKEEPING

- Bathroom waste
- Filters (air, furnace, water, vacuum)
- Vacuum bags and floor sweepings

Curbside Container Rules:

To ensure your containers are emptied,
please follow these directions.



1. Refer to **What Goes Where** for a list of acceptable materials.
2. **Recyclables** need to be within **transparent bags** in the blue recycling container. **Waste items** need to be within **bags of any colour** in the brown waste container.
3. **Close the lid securely** to prevent littering.
4. **Park it by 8 a.m.** on collection days, **with wheels against the curb** (or just off the roadway) and the front side facing the centre of the road.
5. **Leave an arm's length of clearance** on all sides.

NO RESIDENTIAL TIPPING FEES !

Our landfills and transfer stations **DO NOT** charge tipping fees for loads of residential waste and recyclables that weigh less than 500 kg (approx. 1,100 lbs) in total.

REUSE CENTRES



**You never know
what you'll find!**

All of our landfills and transfer stations feature Reuse Centres, where you can drop off and pick up clean, gently used items at no charge. For health reasons, items like clothing, bedding and childcare items like cribs are not accepted.



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE ROUND-UPS Held annually in June & Oct.

Household Hazardous Waste Round-Ups are your opportunity to safely dispose of hazardous items that are not normally accepted at landfills and transfer stations. These events are for **RESIDENTIAL** hazardous waste items only.

Examples of household hazardous waste may include:

- Unused cleaning solutions
- Corrosive or toxic cleaning products
- Darkroom chemicals
- Poisons for insect and rodent control, etc.

Call (780) 623-6739 if unsure! Hazardous items can harm the environment if they are not disposed of safely and properly.

to 4:30 p.m. on the days noted.

Craigend TS: Wednesdays and Saturdays
Hylo TS: Wednesdays and Saturdays
Owl River TS: Tuesdays and Saturdays
Rich Lake TS: Tuesdays and Saturdays

CURBSIDE PICKUP PROGRAM

Hamlet of Lac La Biche:
Tuesdays

Plamondon, rural subdivisions:
Wednesdays

Note:
Statutory holidays may affect
landfill and transfer station hours
and curbside collection dates.

COMPOSTING FOR ORGANIC WASTE



Consider composting for leaf and yard waste, leftover food scraps and other organic waste, rather than just disposing of it.

Tumbling composters are sold at our County Centre office (13422 Highway 881) for \$72 each, plus GST.



Green Cones are also available. Green cones harness the power of the sun to break down and digest food waste, including some items like bones that can't be composted. If you use it correctly, more than 90% of what you put in it will be absorbed by the surrounding soil.

Green Cones are sold at our County Centre office (13422 Highway 881) for \$116 each, plus GST.



COMING SOON! A compost pad at Beaver Lake Landfill will be ready in 2023 for leaf and yard waste.
