Municipal land management policies: The process for applying to use County land for private purposes

Do you need a little extra space? Lac La Biche County has policies and procedures in place for requests made from private landowners and businesses to use County-owned lands.

When a request is made to lease lands for agricultural purposes or storage as examples, a Land Lease Agreement would be considered under County Policy PI-61-004.

There are several ways landowners can take advantage of these policies, such as placing bistro tables and chairs on the sidewalk. In these cases, a License of Occupation Agreement would be considered under County Policy PI-61-015.

Lac La Biche County may consider entering into an Encroachment Agreement with landowners who have constructed a private structure or landscaping improvements which encroaches onto adjoining lands owned by the County. This would be considered under Policy PI-61-014. This does not include lands registered as Environmental Reserve or which are identified as bearing the same traits as Environmental Reserve. In these instances, a formal letter is required along with the detail of the use or activity. Administration will review the request with the relevant operating department responsible for the subject land and determine if the use or activity is compatible with adjacent land uses. Once the proposal is approved and the agreement is signed, there may be applicable fees associated with the use and or activity.

If a resident wants to apply for leasing and/ or purchasing non-required statutory road allowances and registered forced road allowance respectively, this could result in a road closure. If residents wish to begin this process, an application form along with the applicable fees are required. There may be additional costs associated with the matter and determined on case by case basis. This process is regulated under Policy PI-30-017.

Community Access Bus relaunching to the public

The Community Access Bus is ready to take on passengers again, and anyone is welcome to hop on.

Community Access Service

The Community Access service is available to help reduce transportation barriers in the community. With affordable fares and 13 bus stop locations, this bus service is open to all residents.

- The Community Access Service is for everyone. If you can walk on the bus unassisted, this bus service is for you.
- No registration is required for service within the hamlet of Lac La Biche.
- The service features new, on-demand flexible routing.
- Rural service is available within Lac La Biche County. You must pre-register and book ahead for rural service.
- Fares are \$2 for bus stop pick-up in Lac La Biche, and \$8 for rural door-to-door service (within Lac La Biche County).

Paratransit Service

The Paratransit Service is available county-wide for anyone over the age of 60, or anyone with a disability (even if it's temporary). With affordable fares and door-to-door service, Paratransit Service is a reliable option for those who need transportation help.

- Fares are \$4 and provide one-way, door-to-door service in the hamlet of Lac La Biche, and \$8 one-way door-todoor for rural service (within Lac La Biche County).
- There is a fast and simple registration process.
- You don't have to be in a wheelchair to use the service, but wheelchair service is available.
