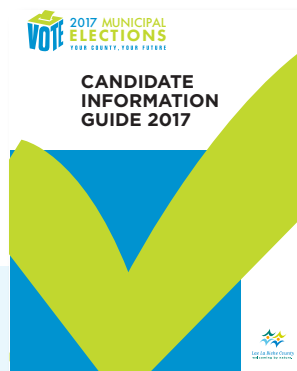

8 councillors
WHO REPRESENT
7 wards.

One councillor represents each ward, except for ward 7 (the hamlet of Lac La Biche). Ward 7 has two councillors who represent it. Residents only vote for the nominated councillor candidates in their ward. Because the Mayor is elected at-large, every resident of Lac La Biche County can vote for the mayoral candidate of their choice.

A PERSON IS
not eligible
TO BE NOMINATED AS
A CANDIDATE IF, ON
NOMINATION DAY:

- The person is an auditor of Lac La Biche County;
- The person is an employee of Lac La Biche County, unless the person takes a leave of absence without pay. County employees that wish to be nominated may notify their employer on or after July 1, but before the employee's last working day prior to nomination day;
- The person is indebted to Lac La Biche County for taxes in default exceeding \$50;
- The person is indebted to Lac La Biche County for any debt exceeding \$500 for more than 90 days; and
- The person has, within the 10 previous years, been convicted of an offence under the *Local Authorities Election Act*.
