



WHAT GOES WHERE?

CURBSIDE PICK-UP

All waste and recycling must be bagged before placed in containers.

BLUE CONTAINERS (RECYCLING)

These items can also be deposited at a landfill or transfer site. For more information about sorting recyclables for return at landfills and transfer sites, see reverse. Fees may apply for recyclable loads brought in by industrial, commercial or institutional customers.

PLASTIC

- Empty and rinsed. Plastic labels are fine. Rigid plastics #1 to #7 grade
- Household bottles and containers and their lids: vinegar, shampoo, detergent, pop/water, milk, yogurt, etc.
- Clean plastic bags: grocery and retail
- Wine corks, cd cases, cassettes with magnetic tape removed

HOUSEHOLD METAL

- Cans and lids (food, beverage, soup), rinsed and dry
- Clean aluminum foil

PAPER AND CARDBOARD

- Newsprint, flyers, envelopes, cards
- Writing and computer paper, sticky notes, shredded paper (blue-bagged before going into the container, to prevent wind-blown litter)
- Paper bags
- Magazines and books
- Gift wrap (non-metallic)
- Cardboard boxes (flattened to fit in container)
- Paper coffee/drink cups (clean, rinsed, dried)
- Box board (cereal boxes, etc.)

REDEEMABLE ITEMS

The following should be saved and redeemed for deposit at the recycling depot. However, you may also put these items in blue containers for curbside pickup:

- Milk jugs and cartons
- Tetra-paks (juice boxes)
- Pop/beverage bottles, both glass and plastic
- Pop/beverage cans

LEAF AND YARD WASTE PICK-UP

Leaf and yard waste pick-up program will be implemented soon. Please check laclabichcounty.com for updates.

- Grass clippings
- Plants
- Leaves
- Tree trimmings and branches

BROWN CONTAINERS (SOLID WASTE)

These items can also be disposed of at a landfill or transfer site. Fees will apply for loads brought in by industrial, commercial and institutional customers.

PLASTIC

- Any recyclables contaminated with food (ex. aluminum foil, plastic saran wrap, etc.)
- Records

METAL

PAPER AND CARDBOARD

- Soiled paper or cardboard (take-out containers, pizza boxes)
- Tissue, paper towels, dryer sheets, laminated paper items
- Pet food bags, flour bags, etc.

FOOD WASTE

- Table scraps, spoiled food, cooking oil/grease (cooled)
- Meat remains/bones/shells (wrapped in newspaper; no carcasses)

GLASS / CERAMICS

- Plate glass, mirrors, broken glass (wrapped in paper), food jars
- Incandescent light bulbs

STYROFOAM

ORGANICS

- Pet feces/kitty litter (bagged)
- Cigarette/wood ashes (bagged); no coals among ashes, cold ashes only

HOUSEKEEPING

- Bathroom garbage
- Wax (crayons, candles)
- Filters (air, furnace, water, vacuum),
- Vacuum bags, dusters, steel wool
- Water softener products
- Residential construction scraps (only if they fit in the bin)

LANDFILLS AND TRANSFER STATIONS

RECYCLING

These items can be deposited at a landfill or transfer site. All recyclable materials must be sorted and clean for return. Place plastic, metal, paper and cardboard in their corresponding containers. Fees may apply for recyclable loads brought in by industrial, commercial, or institutional customers.

PLASTIC

- Empty and rinsed. Plastic labels are fine.
- Rigid plastics #1 to #7 grade
- Household bottles and containers and their lids: vinegar, shampoo, detergent, pop/water, milk, yogurt, etc.
- Clean plastic bags: grocery and retail

MIXED PAPER

- Newsprint, flyers
- Envelopes, cards
- Writing and computer paper, sticky notes
- Shredded paper (blue-bagged before going into the blue container, to prevent wind-blown litter)
- Paper bags
- Magazines and books (hard/plastic covers removed)
- Gift wrap (non-metallic)
- Paper coffee/drink cups (clean, rinsed, dried)

CARDBOARD

- Corrugated cardboard boxes (flatten to fit in container)
- Box board (cereal boxes, etc.)

APPLIANCES AND METAL

- Anything with a battery or cord
- BBQs, lawnmowers, tools, fridges, ovens, etc.
- Cans and lids (food, beverage, soup) rinsed and dry with labels removed
- Fire extinguishers, propane tanks (emptied and vented)

CEMENT AND ASPHALT

SOIL, GRAVEL (CLEAN)

**Call prior to disposal*

AUTOMOTIVE / MOTORIZED

- Tires, car batteries and car parts (fluids removed)
- ATVS

HAZARDOUS WASTE

Deposit these household items at Hazardous Waste Round-ups in June and October. Check laclabicherecounty.com for dates. For medical waste, contact your local pharmacy or medical centre.

AUTOMOTIVE FLUIDS

- Corrosive/poisonous cleaners
- Lawn and garden chemicals herbicides, pesticides, fertilizer (liquids)

REDEEMABLE ITEMS

The following should be saved and redeemed for deposit at the local bottle depot.

- Milk jugs & cartons, tetra-paks (juice boxes)
- Pop/beverage bottles, both glass and plastic
- Pop/beverage cans

CLEAN WOOD (NO NAILS)

- Non painted, untreated
- Wood chips, stumps, brush, roots

CONTAMINATED WOOD

- Painted, pressure treated, varnished, waxed
- Contains preservatives

LIGHTING

- Fluorescent tubes/ballasts, compact fluorescents, halogens, etc.

PAINTS AND FINISHES

- Paint/stain (empty or full cans), varnish
- Wood preservatives, aerosol cans

ELECTRONICS

- TVs, laptops, tablets, computer monitors, servers, speakers, cables, keyboards and mouse
- Printers, copiers, scanners and fax machines
- Ink cartridges

OTHER

- Batteries (any kind)
- Glycol

OIL PRODUCTS AND PESTICIDE CONTAINERS

- Automotive oils, oil filters, oil containers (Plamondon, Beaver Lake and Rich Lake are the only sites who accept oil products)
- Pesticide containers (all sites - triple rinsed)

OTHER

- Photo chemicals
- Turpentine, paint remover
- Butane, kerosene, empty lighters

SOLID WASTE

PLASTIC / METAL

- Any recyclables contaminated with food (ex. aluminum foil, plastic saran wrap, etc.)

PAPER AND CARDBOARD

- Soiled paper or cardboard, including soiled cardboard take-out containers and pizza boxes
- Tissue, paper towels, dryer sheets
- Pet food bags, flour bags, etc.
- Laminated paper items

FOOD WASTE

- Table scraps, spoiled food, peelings
- Meat remains/bones/shells (wrapped in newspaper; no carcasses)
- Cooking oil/grease, cooled

GLASS/CERAMICS

- Dishes, cups, ceramic or clay items
- Plate glass, mirrors, broken glass (wrapped in paper)
- Incandescent light bulbs

STYROFOAM

ORGANICS

- Leather
- Pet feces/kitty litter (bagged)
- Cigarette/wood ashes (cold ash only)

HOUSEKEEPING

- Bathroom garbage
- Wax (crayons, candles)
- Filters (air, furnace, water, vacuum)
- Vacuum bags, dusters, steel wool
- Water softener products
- Residential construction scraps (only if they fit in the bin)

LEAF AND YARD WASTE

- Grass clippings, plants, leaves
- Tree trimmings and branches

REUSE CENTRES

Every landfill and transfer site has a Reuse Centre. Bring your gently-used household items. They may find a new home with someone else and divert waste from our landfills.
