



2021 FireSmart assessments available for free

Spring is just around the corner, but that means wildfire season is too. Lac La Biche County can help you get your home ready for wildfire season by performing a free FireSmart assessment and wood chipping services on your property.

Lac La Biche County Fire Chief John Kokotilo says an assessment helps residents identify specific actions they can take to reduce wildfire risks on their property. These include, but aren't limited to, wildfire fuel reduction (thinning/laddering trees, cutting tall grass), building construction, and fuel source (like propane tanks) relocation.

Kokotilo adds that in the last three years, Lac La Biche County has averaged 80-100 assessments and wood chipping projects annually.

"These initiatives have helped to ensure that those residences that were involved in our program have just become that less susceptible to wildfire," he says. "Residents that had previous FireSmart mitigation can usually look at a three-to-five year reoccurring maintenance schedule."

Kokotilo says that on top of providing an increased sense of safety, being part of a FireSmart community also helps residents develop closer relationships with neighbours and local fire agencies, as well as a sense of pride in caring for the natural environment around the community.

It is a wonderful opportunity for residents to work together and promotes healthy living.

The County is considering a potential relocation of the community garden. Another area of consideration is utilizing raised beds; however, there is a cost associated to build these and may require the gardener to pay an annual fee to utilize the raised bed plots. Overall, Council has directed staff to encourage more feedback from residents to guide changes and decisions to ensure the experience in the community garden is improved and positive.

Dust Abatement Program Applications Open

If springtime dust is an issue at your property, Lac La Biche County's free Dust Abatement Program can help you deal with it.

In accordance with policy, a one-time application is available for a distance of up to 200 metres on municipal roadways directly in front of farmsteads, residences, cemeteries, community organizations, churches and businesses.

Applications received on or before April 30 will automatically be incorporated into the dust abatement program provided the request is compliant with policy. Applications received after April 30 and up to June 1 may be transitioned into the dust abatement program if scheduling permits.
