BYLAW 10-016 OF LAC LA BICHE COUNTY

A BYLAW OF LAC LA BICHE COUNTY IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA TO DESIGNATE THE HEAD OF THE PUBLIC BODY AND TO ESTABLISH FEES UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION AND PROTECTION OF PRIVACY ACT.

WHEREAS under the authority and pursuant to section 95 (a) of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, Chapter F 25, R.S.A. 2000, and amendments thereto, Council must designate a person or group of persons as the head of the local public body for the purposes of the Act;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to section 93 of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, the head of the public body may require an applicant to pay fees as provided in the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Regulation;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to section 95 (b) of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, Council may pass a bylaw to set any fees the local public body requires to be paid under section 93, provided that the fees do not exceed the fees provided in the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Regulation.

NOW THEREFORE under the authority and pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, and by virtue of all other enabling powers, the Council of Lac La Biche County, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

TITLE

This Bylaw may be cited as the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Bylaw.

DEFINITIONS

- 2. In this Bylaw:
 - a) "Act" means the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, Chapter F 25, R.S.A. 2000;
 - b) "Applicant" means a person who makes a request for access to a record under section 7(1) of the Act;
 - c) "County" means Lac La Biche County and includes any board, committee, commission, panel, agency or corporation that is created or owned by Lac La Biche County and all members or officers of which are appointed or chosen by Lac La Biche County, but does not include a board, committee, commission, panel or corporation jointly created with another party (private or public) unless the administration is controlled by the County Administration;

- d) "Chief Administrative Officer" means the person appointed as the Chief Administrative Officer of Lac La Biche County, and includes any person who holds the position of Chief Administrative Officer or in an Acting capacity;
- e) "Province" means the Province of Alberta.

DESIGNATED HEAD

3. For the purposes of the Act, the Chief Administrative Officer is designated as the Head of the County.

FEES

4. Where an Applicant is required to pay a fee for services, the fee is payable in accordance with the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Regulation, AR 186/2008, as amended from time to time or in accordance with any successor Regulation that sets the fees required for information from the Province.

REPEAL

- 5. Town of Lac La Biche Bylaw 1179/01 is hereby repealed.
- 6. Lakeland County Bylaw 99-022 is hereby repealed.

EFFECTIVE DATE

7. This Bylaw shall come into effect upon passing of the third reading.
